RE: Year 4 Home Learning Opportunities

Dear Parent,

I am writing to you regarding the home learning opportunities that are still available to your child.

Continuing from last year, class teachers in KS2 will be assigning a range of activities on a weekly basis that extend their learning at school so they can continue with their work at home. While the school continues to operate a 'no homework' policy we recognise that many parents are keen to support their child's learning at home.

So that you are aware of what activities are available **we will be sending to you a weekly email** every Monday, that will give a summary of the activities that are posted in OneNote.

These activities will potentially include Accelerated Maths activities, key spellings to learn, grammar-based activities and possibly even some writing tasks. In addition, we will also publish links and videos that the children will find useful, in order to give them a head start on the week's lessons. For your child to do Accelerated Maths they have been given an Accelerated Maths workbook to do working out.

While these activities are currently optional, we have had feedback from parents that it is helpful if we set an expectation with the children that they need to be completed. As such, we will be discussing the Homework policy at the **Parent Consultation Evening next Thursday 20th September**.

We will be setting new work on a weekly basis, with the aim that it will be completed by the following week, either in class or at home. We understand that for some this will not be possible every week due to other commitments and we wish to work with you as parents to support your child in their learning. As such please email your class teachers if you are unsure about any aspect of the work set.
