RE: 50 Things To Do Before You're 11¾ - Year 4

Dear Parent,

You may have heard about the National Trust's initiative, '50 things to do before you're 11¾'. You can visit the National Trust website by clicking [here](#). As a school we have decided this will be a great project to get the children involved in, both in and out of school, with you as families. The initiative was discussed at a recent Parent Consultation meeting and received good feedback.

We would like to get children, whatever their age, working towards achieving the '50 things' and take a selfie, or have their photograph taken by you, as evidence of their achievement and to celebrate their success. This is a project that can happen out of school, with you as a family, but will also be integrated into the activities that the children undertake at school. It will be an ongoing project as the children progress through the school. There is therefore no immediate rush to achieve all '50 things'. However, we hope the excitement of participating will encourage the children to get as many done as they can.

There are several ways to share your child's achievements and these are explained below.

1. You can email photos to your child's class teacher who will share the photos with the rest of the class on the classroom screens and during weekly assemblies.
2. You can post photographs on our newly established Facebook group. You can request to join the group [here](#). This is a closed, members only group and therefore the general public will not be able to access it. However, where we have a completed media consent form for your child, we may use photographs. Please request to join the group using the email address we have for you on our database so that we can accept your request to join. We ask that you respect people's privacy and not share any photos outside of this closed group.
3. We have set up a OneNote Project Notebook via Teams which can be accessed by your child at home, using their normal user name and password, in a similar way to accessing home learning. In each individual child's section are the five different areas of the project where children can upload their photos. Please click [here](#) to access your child's OneNote page.
4. Finally, we have set up a hashtag to use on Twitter for those that use this social media platform. Posting photos of your child's achievement using #cornerstone50things will allow us to find the posts easily but please be aware that Twitter is fully in the public domain and therefore anyone can see your posts.

We look forward to seeing photographs of your child's achievements.
